HOME LEARNING

Home learning needs to be completed weekly.

Reading

3x weekly minimum

Initially, children will bring home a reading for pleasure book.

As our phonics knowledge builds, children will also bring home a Read, Write Inc. phonics book and a phonics book.

Friday: book change

Children need to bring in their book bag and we will be swapping reading books. Book bags are not needed on other days.

DAILY

All children need to bring in a named water bottle, a named healthy snack and a named spare change of clothes every day.

Monday: PE

Children need to wear a plain white/blue top and black shorts/jogging bottoms. No other kit please. Pierced ears need taping up before coming to school.

Children need to ensure they have full named school uniform including plain black shoes or trainers.
